

## NOTES TO ACCOMPANY THE SOUTH YORKSHIRE SPORT CONSULTATION PRESENTATION

<b>Slide 1:</b>	<p>This presentation is designed to provide information for those who may not be familiar with what we do. It assumes that the reader will only have a passing understanding of the role of County Sports Partnerships (CSP'S) and the single delivery system for sport in which CSP's now operate</p> <p>Additionally, for those who may be more familiar with our work, this presentation will help you to understand how our role has changed from that of direct delivery of activities to a more strategic, co-ordinating role.</p> <p>Please don't be put off by the size of the presentation (25 slides) and please try to view the whole presentation before you complete our on-line questionnaire</p> <p>Thanks for helping us and we hope you find this presentation useful</p> <p>Bruce Kelsey, Director, South Yorkshire Sport</p>
<b>Slide 2:</b>	<p>South Yorkshire Sport covers the areas of Barnsley, Doncaster, Rotherham and Sheffield and is one of 4 County Sports Partnerships covering the Yorkshire and Humber region. <b>Slide 3:</b>	<p>The current aim of the Partnership was agreed in 2006 by the Partnership Board. This has driven the evolution and transition of the Partnership from it's direct delivery function into the more strategic body we now need to become in order to fully support the delivery system in South Yorkshire.</p> <p>This slide gives you an insight into the sort of work we do now and what we need to do to achieve that ambition.</p>
<b>Slide 4:</b>	<p>The Single Delivery System for sport aims to create a strong link between all those who have a role and interest in the development of sport. It also aims to create a clear pathway to support athletes at all levels and help them to become the best that they can be or want to be.</p> <p>As a County Sports Partnership we sit in the middle of the chain linking local with regional and national delivery.</p> <p><i>People Taking Part</i> - this refers to people delivering sporting opportunities locally to the local population, Innovation is key – right activities, delivered by the right people, in the right place to increase participation</p> <p><i>People behind the people</i> – Supporting the coaches and volunteers who make things happen</p> <p><i>Community Sports Network (CSN)</i> - Grouping of local 'deliverers', Identifying appropriate initiatives for that community, Accountable for all investment, Building capacity to increase participation, <u>NOT</u> another layer of bureaucracy, but a hub for action</p> <p><i>County Sports partnership (CSP)</i> - Partnership of county level decision-makers, Pivotal in delivering 1% per annum increase in participation and wider social benefits</p> <p>Responsible for - Strategic co-ordination and planning, Performance measurement, Marketing and communications</p> <p><i>Regional &amp; National Partners</i> – Governing Bodies of Sport, National agencies such as Sport England, Sports Coach UK etc. Influence and advocacy – generating resources</p> <p>Support, guidance and expertise, Investing Lottery and Exchequer funding</p>
<b>Slide 5:</b>	<p>Here is a list of our current partners. Some organisations contribute financially to the Partnership, others have an interest in how the Partnership can assist them in their work.</p>

	<p>We anticipate that our list of partners will grow as we move into our new strategic function. We will be working hard to ensure that we have the right partners working with us in order to achieve the best outcomes for sport and active recreation across South Yorkshire</p>
<b>Slide 6 and 7:</b>	<p>Partnership staff, and in particular, the Director and Network Manager, have spent the last eight weeks consulting with key partners and organisations to understand more clearly how South Yorkshire Sport could develop.</p> <p>It is fair to say that some of the feedback we have received has been critical of the style and approach we have taken in the past. In most cases, this is justified and fair.</p> <p>Looking forward, we now need to renew our relationships with all partners and come together to create a strong voice for sport in South Yorkshire.</p> <p>These next few slides summarise many of the comments we have received. Also we have added our perceptions of how South Yorkshire appears to be. Please feel free to comment on these or add your own perspective of the challenges we face.</p>
<b>Slide 8:</b>	<p>All of our partners believe that there is a role for the County Sports Partnership – However, that role needs to be defined and then agreed. This is the reason we are consulting with others to identify what that role could be. We have developed, in the following slides what the core team feel this role could and should be. We welcome your views on this and encourage you to suggest alternative roles and functions if you think we haven't got it right.</p>
<b>Slides 9, 10:</b>	<p>Each part of the proposed structure is explained in greater detail in the slides that follow:</p>
<b>Slide 11:</b>	<p>If you would like to see who sits on the South Yorkshire Sports Partnership Board and who they represent please check our website by clicking the link to South Yorkshire Sport – Home then clicking Partnership meetings.</p>
<b>Slide 12:</b>	<p>The Executive is a new structure and currently does not exist.</p> <p>We suggest the membership would be made up of:</p> <p>4 local authority Chief Leisure/Sport Officers Chairs/representatives of each of the 8 themed areas Core South Yorkshire Sport Staff Team</p> <p>In some areas, particularly where Core staff team members have a remit, such as workforce development, governing body liaison and community sport, we would suggest that core staff represent the relevant theme. In others, such as equity, Olympics 2012 and PE/School sport we would look to co-opt key expertise from within South Yorkshire to represent these areas.</p> <p>In some cases, for example Olympics 2012, groups already exist in South Yorkshire to plan for the games and the legacy which follows. In such instances, we do not propose to establish a new group, rather create strong links with those that already exist.</p>
<b>Slides 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24:</b>	<p>In the following slides, we explain what we think are the eight themes and three core functions and what these actually involve.</p> <p>We would welcome your views and thoughts on these.</p> <p>Is there anything missing? Would you like to remove any of the points? Are you aware of any groups currently established in South Yorkshire who are working on this theme and with whom we should link?</p>
